Monday 18th June A visit to the new Museum at the Delaine Smith garage meet at 7pm at the garage.

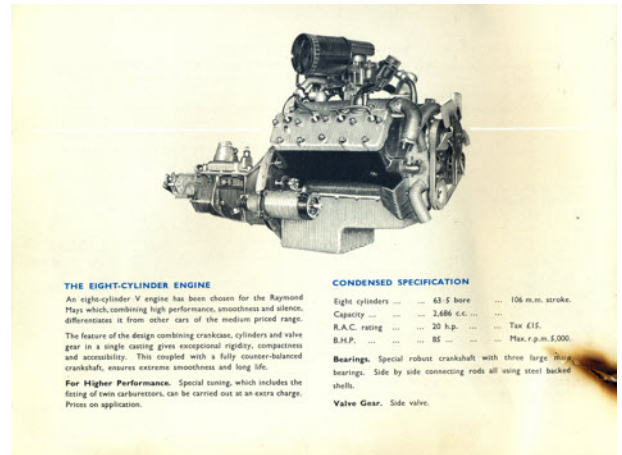
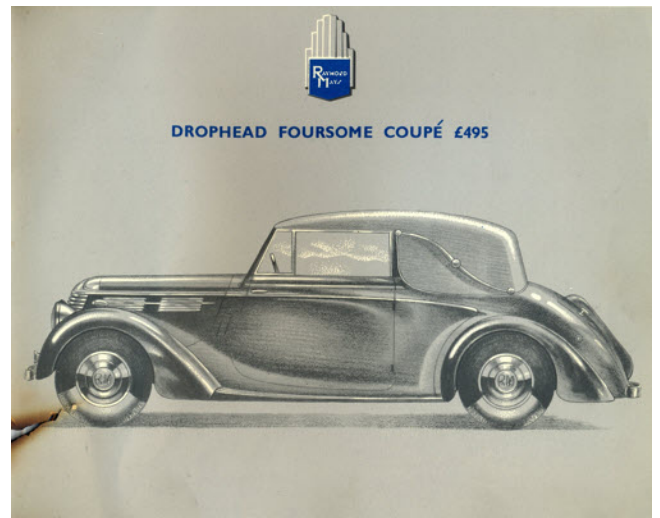
We have welcomed new members.
