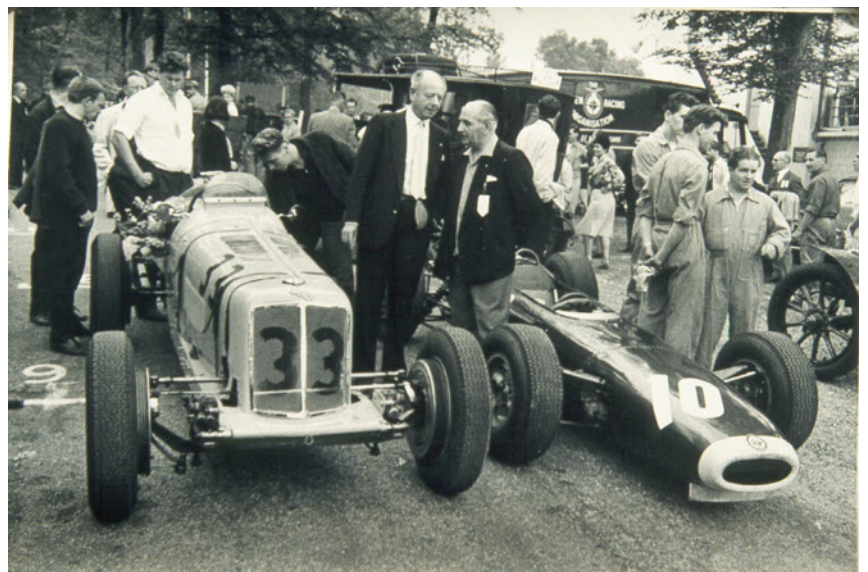


Glass Cabinets
